CENTURY FARM APPLICATION

Eligibility Requirements;

1. Ownership within the same family for 100 or more years by July 4, 19 87 of at least 40 acres of Iowa farmland.
2. Present owner must be related to a person who owned the land at least 100 years ago.
3. Application must be notarized and submitted by June 1, 19 87.

- One Century farm marker per farm will be furnished by Iowa Farm Bureau. Additional markers may be purchased upon request.
- One Century Farm Certificate will be awarded for each **legal farm owner** by the Iowa Department of Agriculture. Additional certificates may be purchased.
- A state-wide Century Farms Award Ceremony is held at the Iowa State Fair every year. You will receive notice as to the time and date of the ceremony in July. If you should have any questions, please call this office at (515)281-5323.

From whom was the farm purchased? John Garaghty & Thomas & Michael Harper who had purchased it from the U S Government

How many acres were in the original parcel? 160 Acres

What was the cost of land per acre? \$15.00 per Acre Purchase price was 2400.00

Where was the first owner born? Germany

Where did he live prior to moving onto the farm? Anton Alpers had purchased some land in 1858 around Witchita, Kansas, but sickness had struck the family so he moved east to Bloomington, Ill.

Was this a homestead? No

Did the first owner farm the land? Yes

Did he engage in any trades or occupations other than farming? No, but J H (Anton) Alpers did work as a harness maker in addition to farming.

Is the original home, or any portion of it or other original buildings, still standing or in use? No

When was the present home built? There are no buildings on the 42 Acres

What are the farm's crops or products? At the present time it is corn and beans
